Located in the Palais de Chaillot, the Cité de l'Architecture opened in 2007 and contains both exhibition halls as well as an extensive architectural library. Its main exhibition, Musée des Monuments Français, is divided into three galleries and focuses on French monuments. Duration: approx. 1 hour 45 minutes	Paris

The first structure built on this site, known as the Palais de Trocadéro, was commissioned for the 1878 World Fair and combined Arabian and Byzantine architectural influences. This Palais de Trocadéro was replaced by the current Palais de Chaillot in 1937 for the International Exhibition.
